Dear Parents,

Parent Teacher Interviews will be conducted on **Tuesday 25th of June and Thursday 27th of June 2019**, between the times of **3.30pm-6.30 pm.** All parents are encouraged to participate together with your child/ren in parent-teacher meetings to discuss your child's progress.

Bookings for Parent / Teacher Interviews can be made through our student portal COMPASS.

To access COMPASS log onto: https://albanvaleps-vic.compass.education. All families have a unique log in code and password to access COMPASS. If you should require this information or need help to book an interview time, please see our office staff for assistance. Parents that do not make a booking via COMPASS will be allocated a time to meet with their child's teacher.

In our endeavour to ensure sustainability of our environment and reduce paper usage, we will only be printing hard copies of students' reports on request. Families will be able to access students' reports online via Compass from Friday 21st of June.

Whilst the reporting process and parent-teacher interviews provide a formal opportunity for parents to meet with their child's teacher, please note that we have an open door policy at Albanvale Primary School, whereby parents are welcome to make a time to see teachers at any point throughout the year.

Sports Awareness Program

The Sports Awareness Program will be held next week. This program enables teachers to meet in teams to plan teaching and learning for next term. Professional Practice Days provide an opportunity for teachers to engage in professional dialogue and ensure consistency and best practice across all classrooms. Further planning and discussion about student progress is undertaken in teams each week.

All students will be involved in the Sports Awareness Program next week, whereby they are engaged in various activities provided by our Enrichment Team. The Enrichment Team tries to provide a diverse curriculum where the students are involved in varied and fun learning experiences. On **Monday 24**th **June**, our grade 3-6 students will participate in a self-guided tour of the National Sports Museum and a guided tour of the MCG stadium. This will be followed by lunch at Yarra Park.

On **Wednesday 26th June,** our grade F-2 students will participate in a variety of activities at the Westgate Party and Play Indoor Sports Centre. Children will be involved in activities such as basketball, indoor soccer, beach volleyball, indoor cricket and kickball.

There will be no lunch orders for the grades that participate in Sports Awareness on these days, so please ensure that your child has a packed lunch and is wearing the correct uniform and hat.

Prep Enrolment 2020

Prep enrolments for 2020 are being taken now. If you have any children who will be attending Albanvale in 2020, please call or visit the school to arrange a tour and receive enrolment information. We encourage families to do this as soon as possible, so that we may begin to plan the prep transition program.



Tips and advice on helping your child have safe and enjoyable experiences online

CYBERBULLYING - supporting your child online

Childhood bullying used to be face-to-face physical and verbal behaviour in the playground, classroom and on the way to and from school. Now online technology and constant connectivity has allowed bullying to harm children through often anonymous contact or actions. Cyberbullying can happen at any time and leave a child feeling unsafe and alone.

Cyberbullying commonly occurs through:

- Comments posted in an open online environment such as Facebook.
- Direct text, email or instant messages online or on a mobile phone.
- Private features on social networking services such as Snapchat and Facebook Messenger.

Children can manage cyberbullying with your support by taking the following action:

- Blocking the person cyberbullying and changing privacy settings. Retaliating or responding to the perpetrator only gives them the attention and power they want.
- Reporting the bullying. Most websites have online safety centres and reporting facilities. Online abuse is in violation of the Terms of Use of most social networking sites. The Office of the eSafety Commission can take complaints and provide assistance in relation to serious cyberbullying material that is directed at a particular child with the intention to seriously embarrass, harass, threaten or humiliate.
- Collecting the evidence. Keeping mobile phone messages and printing emails or IM conversations.
- Talking to someone they trust like parents or a teacher.
- Visiting iParent for a list of sources of professional support including the Kids Helpline on 1800 55 1800, eheadspace on 1800 650 890 or parentline.
- Taking the cyberbullying quiz. There is also a quiz for parents.
- Watch the "Chatterbox" video and listen to the podcast about cyberbullying


