Staffing

This class was established due to the growing number of students we have had enrol at our school since the beginning of the year.

ANZAC Day

Thursday 25th April is the ANZAC day public holiday and students and staff are not required at school. This special day commemorates and acknowledges the ANZACs and all service men and women who have served our country in the armed forces.

Curriculum Day Monday 30th April

NAPLAN

What is Naplan - The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual national assessment for all students in years 3, 5, 7 and 9. All students in these year levels participate in tests in Reading, Writing, Language Conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and Numeracy. The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) 2016 tests for Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 students will be held on **Tuesday 8th, Wednesday 9th and Thursday 10th of May 2018**. All students are expected to participate in the NAPLAN tests. Should your child be unable to participate in the assessment, please see your child's teacher. We encourage all our students to strive to achieve their personal best in preparation and during these tests.

Glasses for Kids

Albanvale Primary School have been fortunate to be chosen as a school to be involved in the 'Glasses for Kids' program for all grade Prep- Grade 3 students. Screening will be held at the school on **Friday 27th April** and it is a <u>free</u> service. All families are eligible for a <u>free</u> pair of glasses should your child require them. Please ensure all consent forms are returned to the school as soon as possible so that so that you can take advantage of this program.

TERM 2 2018

Welcome back to all families of 3-6 students. We hope you all had a wonderful holiday and are all rested and ready for an exciting, and busy new term!

This term, 3-4 students will be working on an Integrated Topic called "Survival of the Fittest." During this topic, we will be exploring the life cycles of living, non-living and once living things and how they depend on each other, and the environment to survive. They will also be investigating the effects of weather and human acts on our Earth. The 5-6 students will be focussing on the topic "Climate Changes and Adaptations." Throughout this unit, we will be considering how living things adapt and what impacts their survival, and how humans respond to natural disasters. The students will also be inquiring, "Earth's Place in Space." These topics will be further enhanced with an Excursion to the Werribee Zoo, where students will consolidate on their understandings of 'Predator and Prey Relationships and Survival'.

In Reading, we will be looking at the comprehension strategies of searching for and using information and Question and Answer Relationship (QAR), in preparation for NAPLAN. As part of searching for and using information and QAR, students will be learning how to locate key information within differing texts and use this information to answer questions about that text. We will also be revisiting the comprehension strategy of inferring, to deepen our understanding of the hidden themes and symbolism authors incorporate to add meaning to their texts.

In Writing, 3-6's will be learning the structure and text features of a persuasive text. We will look at some of the devices an author uses to convince, change or confirm a reader's point of view. Students will also learn how an author's arguments are strengthened by including persuasive techniques such as, fact & opinion, rhetorical questions, repetition, etc.

In Mathematics, students will apply learnt strategies and skills when investigating and solving problems within the mathematical areas of, Addition & Subtraction, Decimals & Percentages and Data. Students will be given a range of opportunities to practise these skills through purposeful learning tasks such as, open ended questions and rich mathematical investigation, relevant to students' lives.

This term the whole school value is "Responsibility." Students show responsibility on a daily basis through making good choices by always having a go, challenging themselves and listening and following all instructions. There are many ways people can demonstrate responsibility within their learning such as, making sure they have all the materials and resources they need prior to starting a learning task, as well as taking the time to revise and edit their work before they give it to a peer or teacher to look at for feedback.

Education Week is held this term, commencing on the 21st of May. This year's theme is "Celebrating the Arts". Students will have the opportunity to showcase and celebrate their learning of dance, drama, music, visual arts and media arts through open days, exhibitions and special events.


