NAPLAN

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) 2016 tests for Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 students will be held on **Tuesday 15th, Wednesday 16th and Thursday 17th of May 2018**. All students are expected to participate in the NAPLAN tests. Should your child be unable to participate in the assessment, please see your child's teacher. We encourage all our students to strive to achieve their personal best in preparation and during these tests.

What is Naplan - The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual national assessment for all students in years 3, 5, 7 and 9. All students in these year levels participate in tests in Reading, Writing, Language Conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and Numeracy.

If your child is involved in the testing, it is important they are supported in the following ways;

- · Ensuring they are well rested and have had a good night's sleep
- · Ensuring they eat healthy meals and snacks
- · Ensuring they engage in some exercise like walking or riding their bikes
- · By re-assuring your child to remain positive, calm and do to their personal best

Australia's Largest Performing Arts Event for Schools

This year, some of our 5/6 students will be participating in the Wakakirri Story Dance competition. Wakakirri is an Australia-wide performing Arts competition, in which hundreds of schools across Australia create Story-Dances for Wakakirri that reflect their students' thoughts, ideas and aspirations. These stories are performed in professional theatres in front of the official 'Wakakirri Panel' who are searching for 'Story of the Year'.

To put this show together, we need your help! We are looking for the following items to make sets, props and costumes:

- Formal/ business appropriate jackets and blazers (in any size or colour from a kids size 11 upwards)
- Plain blue t-shirts, (in any size kids size 11 upwards, plain with no prints on them)
- Large black long sleeve t-shirts, in ladies/mens sizes
