Our teachers are able to digitally share student learning by using an application called Seesaw. Teachers and students will regularly post information on Seesaw so that families are kept abreast with their child's learning journey, including celebratory milestones. All accounts are private and only information relating to your child can be accessed.

We have had a fantastic response to this new way of sharing information between the classroom and home, and encourage families to interact with this new medium.

We also encourage families to sign up to the COMPASS app as the school uses this tool to communicate with families regularly.

Preps

On Monday we welcomed our 2020 prep students to Albanvale Primary School. At present our prep students are undertaking department required assessments. This valuable information will be used by teachers to ensure they are meeting the learning needs of all students.

A reminder to parents that prep students will continue to have Wednesdays off until the 28th February.

Student Enrolment Information

On Friday, families will receive a copy of their Student Enrolment Information to be reviewed and updated. It is very important that our school has the most up to date information for all of our students and families in the event that we should need to contact them in an emergency. This information is also collected as part of the Department of Education and Training CENSUS. Therefore, we ask that parents make any changes to personal details and phone numbers on these forms, and that they are returned to the office by the 14th February 2020.

Assembly

The whole school assembly provides an opportunity for the whole school community to meet and share student achievements for the week. We encourage parents to attend.

In 2020, whole school assemblies will be held at 3:00pm Mondays in order to maximise teaching and learning time in the timetable.

School Council

On Monday the 10th February, School Council Elections for 2020 will open. Information for parents regarding the nomination and election process is attached to this newsletter. I hereby extend an invitation to all parents of our school to nominate for a position. Parents may nominate themselves for a position or another parent of the school. School Councillors hold a very important role in schools and this is an opportunity for parents to be involved in the school by being an active member of School Council. There are three positions under the Parent category available for the 2020–2021 office. If you are interested in becoming a School Councillor please see the office for a nomination form. **Nominations close on Monday the 17**th of February at 4pm.

Education Costs

A notice outlining 2020 Education Costs for essential items was sent home to all families in 2019. The fees provide students with the whole year's supply of additional resources not supplied as part of the curriculum e.g. Sports Awareness. A breakdown of the Education Costs is provided in the notice. It is requested that families return forms with payment as soon as possible. Parents requiring support with Education Costs are asked to present at the office in order to organise a payment plan.

All families with a current Health Care card - Financial Assistance for Camps, Sports and Excursions

The Victorian Government introduced a fund to assist families with the cost of camps, sports and excursions so that all children are able to access learning opportunities beyond the classroom. Parents with a valid means-tested concession card are eligible to apply for the \$125 annual amount, which is paid directly to the school for the benefit of your child and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child. We will be sending home a letter and application form for families to complete for each child. The forms must be completed and returned to school so that the school can enter the application on line.

Outside School Hours Care

Our school offers a before and after care program to all of our families through provider - Sweet Sounds in St Albans. Sweet Sounds provides care from 6.30am before school, and until 6.30 pm after school. Free of charge transportation to and from school is provided as part of the service. A childcare rebate for all children in care, regardless of whether parents are working, is available through Centrelink. Please see our administration office should you require more information about this service.

The Prep, One and Two Team teachers would like to welcome you to 2020. We hope it is a prosperous year for all. Students have settled in well and teachers have commenced English Online Testing on all students. These tests assist in informing teachers with planning for different learning needs.

This term in Integrated Studies, students will develop an understanding of themselves through the topics 'Marvellous Me' (Prep) and 'We Belong' (Grade 1/2). Students will learn about their personal, physical and social health, and relationships with families, friends and communities.

In Reading, the Preps will be learning Concepts about Print, while the Grade 1/2's will be focusing on solving words and sustaining fluency when reading. In Writing, the Preps will be encouraged to write independently about their experiences, and the Grade 1/2 students will be learning to write recounts using the correct structure. In Mathematics, our focus will be in the area of Number Sense (Counting and Place Value).

Some important reminders...



- We are a Sun Smart school so children need to wear a wide brimmed hat at school EVERY day.

School Wide Positive Behaviour

Our mission at Albanvale Primary School to ensure each student develops into a curious, critical and creative 21st century thinker and learner. To achieve this, our school follows the School-Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS) framework to nurture a community centered around a positive, safe and supportive learning culture. In 2019, through significant consultation between students, families and staff together agreed to a set of expectations that were developed to provide a clear understanding of the behaviours we must exhibit in each area of our school community. From their first day of school, each class has been discussing and practicing each of these school expectations to ensure all students know how they can demonstrate excellence at school.

To further encourage the positive behaviour our students regularly exhibit, the APS 'High Five!' acknowledgement system has been introduced, which can be awarded by any staff member to a student. Later this term, our elected leaders will be holding our first APS Market Stall giving students the opportunity to exchange their High Five Cards for a range of rewards.

We are encouraging all families to become familiar with the expectations outlined in the Behaviour Matrix, engage in discussions with your child about the expected behaviours and celebrate with them when they receive a High Five card. By keeping the focus on nurturing the positive behaviours expected of all students at our school, we can achieve excellence together.



Term 1, 2020

Welcome back to all families of 3-6 students. We hope you all had a wonderful holiday and are all rested and ready for an exciting and busy new year!

This term, 3-6 students will be working on an Integrated topic focusing on being 'Ready to Learn'. During this topic, will we be exploring the way students learn, the different mindsets that could contribute to their success and the role that emotions play within your child's education. This topic aims to teach students about teamwork, responsibility and engage them in the learning process.

In Reading, we will be looking at the comprehension strategy of Searching For and Using Information. As part of searching for and using information, students will be learning how to locate key information within differing texts and use this information to answer questions about that text. We will be also looking at the comprehension strategy of Inferring to understand information that the author has not directly stated. To support your child in their reading at home engage in the 30 minute process of take home reading.

In Writing, the 3-6's will be learning the structure and text features of a realistic narrative. We will look at the some of the devices an author uses to engage readers and explore themes and ideas. Students will also learn how an author's ideas can be extended with the use of descriptive language and language features such as, metaphors and similes.

In Mathematics, students will apply learnt strategies and skills when investigating and solving problems within the mathematical areas of Place Value and Shape, Angles and Location. Students will be given ample opportunities to practice these skills through learning tasks such as open ended questions and rich mathematical investigation, relevant to students' lives. To further enhance your child's problem solving skills ensure that your child is completing their weekly Math Mates.

This term the whole school value is 'Excellence'. Students show excellence on a daily basis by striving to achieve their best. There are many ways that people can demonstrate excellence within their learning, such as making the right choice when faced with a problem and giving their best effort when faced with a new concept.

As per the school's uniform policy, it is imperative that all students are wearing the correct full school uniform, every day. Having a school uniform and wearing it appropriately and correctly allows students to feel equal and promotes a sense of identity and pride for their school. Please ensure that your child is wearing the correct school uniform every day, including hair accessories and socks.

Term 1



Welcome back to all Albanvale families from the Enrichment team. We hope you all had a wonderful holiday and are all rested and ready for an exciting new year! This newsletter outlines the learning that will take place within the Enrichment program in term 1.



Ciao a tutti! Benvenuti to a new school year! I am very excited to be the Italian teacher this year, and I look forward to teaching your children Italian in 2020.

Italian at Albanvale Primary School will be a fun, dynamic and authentic approach to teaching a language.

In weekly 60 minute lessons, every student from Prep/Foundation to Year 6 will learn Italian using a mixture of games, singing, dancing, speaking, listening and movement. Students will be exposed to the language and culture through a variety of authentic resources including maps, brochures, posters, post cards, images, artefacts, as well as a variety of ICT resources including YouTube videos, songs, voice clips and images.

Each term students will cover a range of topics that incorporate both cultural and linguistic elements of the Italian language.

During term one, the students from grade 3 to 6 will cover and revise the areas of:

- Greetings
- Classroom commands
- Colours
- Numbers
- Expressing likes and dislikes
- Feelings and emotions
- Days of the week
- Months of the year

Why learn a language?

Research has shown that learning another language can:

- Stimulate brain development
- Significantly enhance English literacy skills
- Improve memory, concentration and numeracy skills
- Improve overall performance at school
- Encourage respect and understanding of other cultures

Visual Arts

Welcome to a new year of exciting art activities this term. The focus for Foundation students this term is drawing, whereby students will learn to use a variety of drawing materials to create art works. Students will learn to include different shapes and patterns in their work and will also experience drawing on different surfaces such as paper, fabric, wood, wet and dry surfaces.

The focus for Grade 1/2s this term is drawing, whereby students will continue to use a variety of tools and materials to create art works. Students will continue to explore the elements of art and draw about subjects that are familiar to them. For example, self-portraits, family and special places.

The focus for Grade 3/4s this term is drawing and painting, whereby students will continue to use a variety of materials and techniques to create art works. Students will explore different art works depicting emotions and will use crayons to draw lines and shapes that express a specific emotion. They will also experiment with colour blending using water paints and pastels.

The focus for Grade 5/6s this term is drawing and painting, whereby students will continue to use a variety of materials and techniques to create art works. Students will look at art works by Mondrian and Kandinsky focusing on shape, space and colour and combine these elements into creating their own artwork.

STEM stands for Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics. These subject areas will be explored throughout the school year, with a change of focus in each term. STEM learning involve scientific and technological understanding, as well as practicing hands-on skills through experimentation and design.

The first term will introduce Foundation students to learning in STEM and classroom expectations. They will be exposed to a variety of STEM experiences: Lego play, iPads, VR, simple experiment, small design task, and Beebots.

Grade 1/2 students will become Data Detectives. They will collect, sort and represent different types of data both as soft-copy (digitally) and hard-copy. Students will also further their knowledge of algorithms by collaborating to solve a problem. The will instruct a robotic device (e.g. Beebot or Probot) to move from one location to another and avoid obstacles, using direct instruction and sensing.

Grade 3/4 students will explore a range of digital systems with peripheral devices (input, output, storage) for different purposes, and transmit different types of data. They will build a device and program it to transmit a message (e.g. using Lego WeDo).

Grade 5/6 students will also investigate how digital systems are connected together to form networks that transmit data, using the school network as a model.

Physical Education (P.E.)

Welcome back to the New Year! Once more we look forward to an action packed term in P.E focusing on improving our physical fitness, sporting abilities, game sense and sporting etiquette.

In Prep/1/2, students will be focusing on safety skills, procedures and working co-operatively with others when playing games and using equipment. Students will also be developing our fundamental movement skills, such as throwing and catching through active play, structured movement activities and minor games.

In Grades 3-6, students will be learning to apply basic rules and scoring systems, and demonstrate fair play when participating in a variety of invasion sports. Students will explore defensive and offensive strategies through playing a variety of modified games. They will also develop, practise and apply strategies to be able to work co-operatively in groups and teams. In addition, the students in Grades 5/6 will have the opportunity to participate in Interschool Sport against neighbouring schools in the DPPSSA network.

A reminder that students must be dressed in appropriate sporting attire and bring a hat and water bottle to each lesson.

As you may be aware, the situation regarding the emerging

outbreak of novel coronavirus has continued to evolve. Over the weekend, the Commonwealth's Chief Medical Officer and Victoria's Chief Health Officer recommended a stronger precautionary approach to managing coronavirus for travellers returned from mainland China (not including Hong Kong, Macau and Taiwan) from 1 February 2020.

This recommendation is that parents/guardians/carers should ensure that any children returning from mainland China (not including Hong Kong, Macau and Taiwan) who were in mainland China on or after 1 February 2020 is isolated at home and should not attend school until 14 days after they were last in mainland China.

This recommendation does not apply retrospectively. It applies only to students who were in mainland China on or after 1 February 2020.

The existing advice remains that parents/guardians/carers of students should ensure that any student is isolated at home and should not attend school for 14 days:

following exposure to any confirmed novel coronavirus case;

after leaving Hubei Province.

If you think your children are showing relevant symptoms, please call the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) to discuss further actions on 1300 651 160.

DHHS has developed <u>fact sheets</u> in English and Simplified Chinese which include the latest information and advice.

School Council Elections - Information for Parents

WHAT IS A SCHOOL COUNCIL AND WHAT DOES IT DO?

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally constituted bodies that are given powers to set the key directions of a school within statewide guidelines. In doing this, a school council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students

WHO IS ON THE SCHOOL COUNCIL?

For most school councils, there are three possible categories of membership: A mandated elected Parent category – more than one-third of the total members must be from this category. Department of Education and Training (DET) employees can be Parent members at their child's school as long as they are not engaged in work at the school

- A mandated elected DET employee category members of this category may make up no more than onethird of the total membership of school council. The principal of the school is automatically one of these members.
- An optional Community member category members are co-opted by a decision of the council because of their special skills, interests or experiences. Department employees are not eligible to be Community members.

Generally, the term of office for all members is two years. The term of office of half the members expires each year, creating vacancies for the annual school council elections.

WHY IS PARENT MEMBERSHIP SO IMPORTANT?

Parents on school councils provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills that can help shape the direction of the school. Those parents who become active on a school council find their involvement satisfying and may find that their children feel a greater sense of belonging.

DO I NEED SPECIAL EXPERIENCE TO BE ON SCHOOL COUNCIL?

Each member brings their own valuable life skills and knowledge to the role. Councilors may need to develop skills and acquire knowledge in areas that are unfamiliar to them. What you do need is an interest in your child's school and the desire to work in partnership with others to help shape the school's future.

HOW CAN YOU BECOME INVOLVED?

The most obvious way is to vote in the elections, which are held in Term one each year. However, ballots are only held if more people nominate as candidates than there are positions vacant.

In view of this, you might consider

- standing for election as a member of the school council
- · encouraging another person to stand for election.

WHAT DO YOU NEED TO DO TO STAND FOR ELECTION?

The principal will issue a Notice of Election and Call for Nominations following the commencement of Term one each year. All school council elections must be completed by the end of March unless the usual time line has been varied by the Minister. If you decide to stand for election, you can arrange for someone to nominate you as a candidate or you can nominate yourself in the Parent category. Department employees whose child is enrolled in a school in which they are not engaged in work are eligible to nominate for parent membership of the school council at that school. Once the nomination form is completed, return it to the principal within the time stated on the Notice of Election. You will receive a Nomination Form Receipt in the mail following the receipt of your completed nomination. Generally, if there are more nominations received than there are vacancies on council, a ballot will be conducted during the two weeks after the call for nominations has closed.


